Dear valued ASDC member,

A huge thank you for your continued support for the Association for Science and Discovery Centres (ASDC). In these uncertain times we really are stronger together.

Our last membership year started with the findings from our first annual member survey (thank you to everyone who shared data) and the acclaimed CEO Away Day attended by 27 senior figures from organisations across the UK. Over the course of the year we ran a series of Space Community Calls connecting 195 space engagement professionals from 97 separate organisations as part of the Our World From Space programme, delivered three social media workshops attended by 35 people from 13 different member organisations, and curated 11 Members' Forums attended by over 250 people. The annual conference in November saw a record 240 delegates attend, with 100 speakers, 35 sessions and four eminent keynote speakers highlighting how we can all shape the future of science together.

Nurturing our members grows a strong national foundation on which we can build exciting, innovative science projects, driving engagement in STEM and increasing accessible pathways that will address the fundamental inequalities that persist within the sciences. As part of a recent project we've mapped out the data to show the reach of ASDC members in terms of number of schools they work with, highlighting the true extent and value of the network for supporting with both curriculum subjects and the UK's cultural engagement in science.

As an ASDC member, your organisation has helped to shape national policies, whilst also benefiting from industry research, best-practice toolkits, and valuable engagement resources. The 2025 survey has also provided us with clear data for future direction and goal setting, much of which is in action already. It is very pleasing to see how we are viewed and valued by our members, but the hard work does not stop, there is still much to do.

Together, we can continue to inspire future generations and advance public engagement and involvement with science. Your membership fee directly helps us to work towards a society where science is accessible, inclusive and valued by all as a fundamental part of everyday life. Renewing your membership with ASDC allows us to continue to champion the UK's network of regional science and discovery centres, research and outreach centres and science museums for 2025-26.
